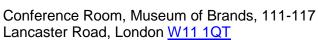
### 4.4 Winter Preparedness 2018/19

The Chief Nurse / Director of Quality presented the paper, which outlined winter preparedness plans for each Trust across NW London: Chelsea and Westminster Hospital NHS Foundation Trust, The Hillingdon Hospitals NHS Foundation Trust, Imperial College Healthcare NHS Trust and London North West Healthcare NHS Trust.

The Governing Body discussed the following:

- Reducing the number of beds occupied by long stay patients by 25%;
- All acute hospitals providing ambulatory emergency care service at least 12 hours a day, 7 days a week by September 2019;
- Reducing breaches of the 4 hour A&E waiting time standard down to zero;
- Improving ambulance handovers so that 100% of patients arriving at an Emergency Department were handed over within 30 minutes of the ambulance's arrival;
- Implementing effective demand management schemes in out of hospital services to support the management of flows into emergency care services in hospitals;
- Holding a review after the winter period.
